Call to Order and Welcome

Chair Stafford called the meeting to order at 1:32 p.m. and welcomed members of the board, staff, and visitors. Chair Stafford announced that in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act, the press had been notified of the meeting, but no press members were in attendance. Chair Stafford acknowledged that the agenda was posted on the GTC website. Chair Stafford also acknowledged that a quorum of Board members was present.

Approval of Minutes

A motion was made by Mr. Southerlin to approve the March 21, 2018, minutes. Mr. Smith seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Mr. Clayton provided an update on the Center for Manufacturing. Mr. Clayton focused on three main facets: 1) community outreach and recruiting, 2) industry partnerships, and 3) academics and student services. (See attached presentation.)

With the addition of the adventure tech summer day camps, CMI will have students from sixth grade to Ph.D. taking classes this year.

Enrollment has increased 11% from Fall Semester 2016 and 8% from Spring Semester 2017. There will be approximately 160 students on campus this summer.

Dr. Whirl noted that the turnout for CMI open houses has been excellent thanks in part to Marketing's publicity and advertising; however, the conversion rate to student has been low. The most significant challenge continues to be changing the parent mindset from yesterday's manufacturing to today's manufacturing technology. Dr. Whirl's team and Dr. Jones' team are working together to ensure a connection is made with the students before leaving. There is an increase in the attention that business and industry are paying to encouraging students to come to GTC and transfer to a four year university or enroll at GTC and enter the workforce to meet industry needs.

There being no old or new business, Mr. Smith made a motion to adjourn. Mr. Shouse seconded the motion. The motion carried.

The meeting adjourned at 1:41 p.m.

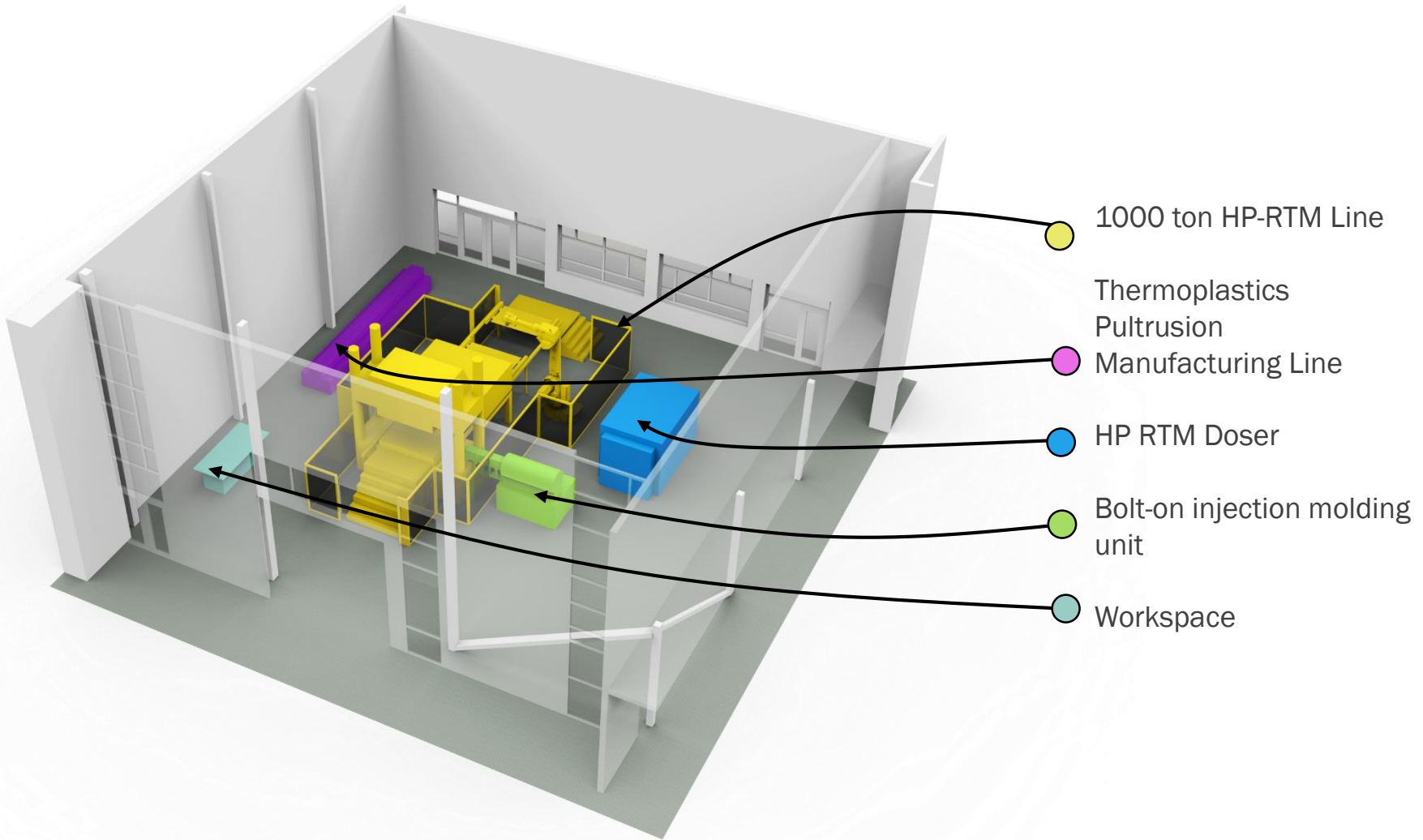

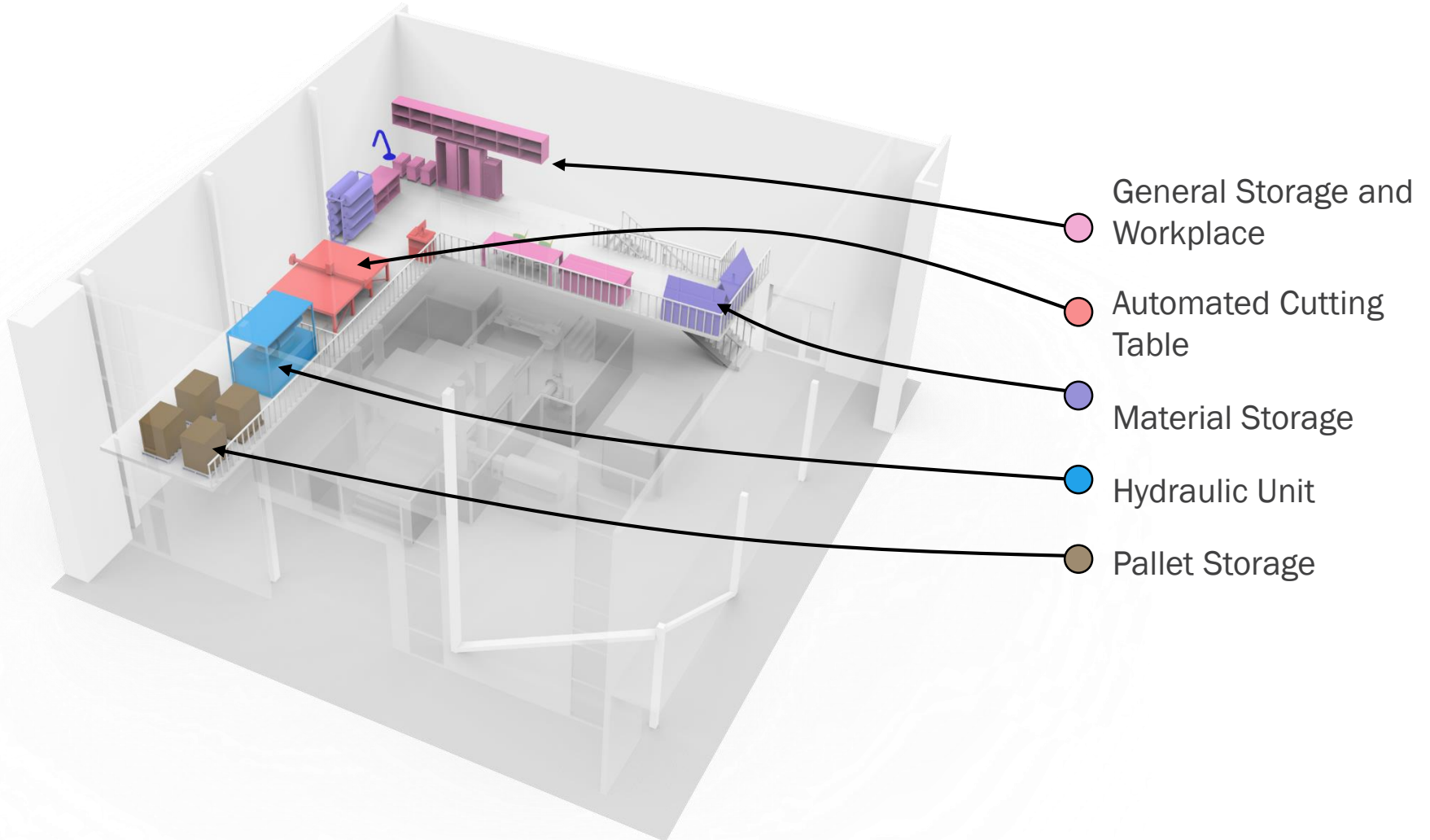

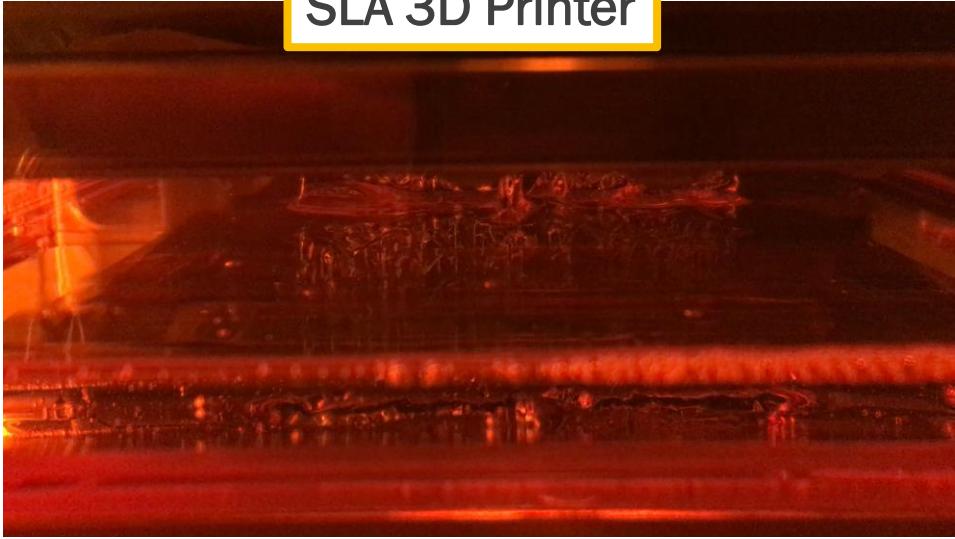

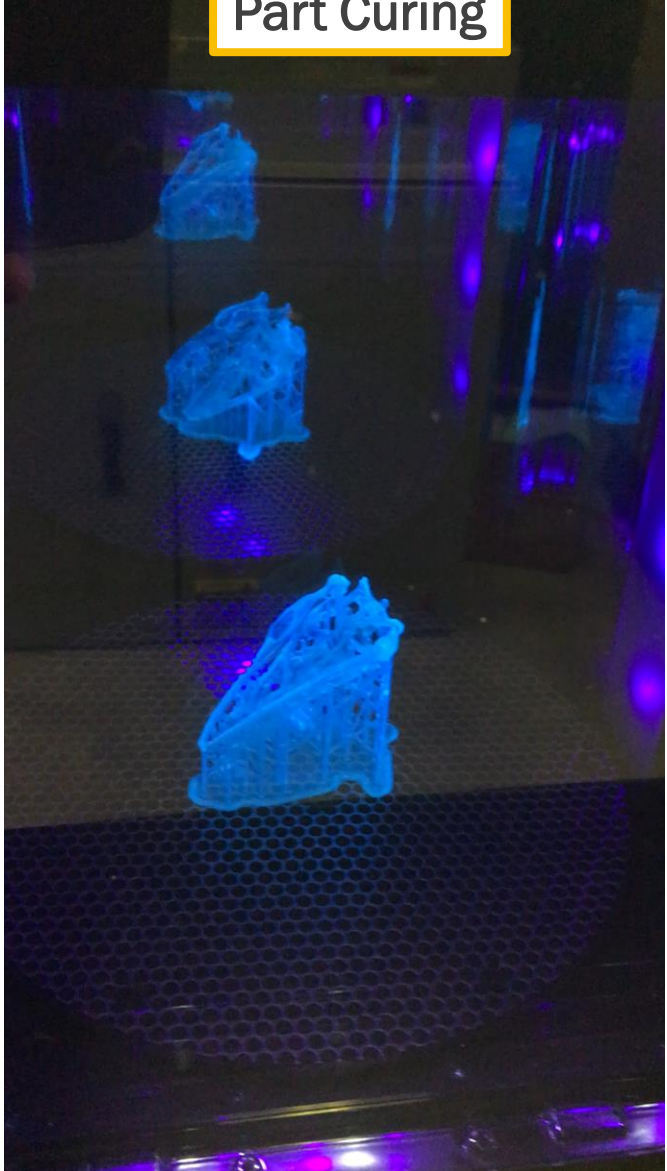
