
CHE Update – Mr. Batson provided a brief update on CHE.


There being no old or new business, Mr. Howard made a motion to adjourn. Mr. Stafford seconded the motion. The motion carried.



- Implement a different higher ed business model




Total Revenues




Student Revenues




County Revenues










TOTAL REVENUES BY MONTH

Total Revenue




EXPENSES BY TYPE NOVEMBER 30 YTD


